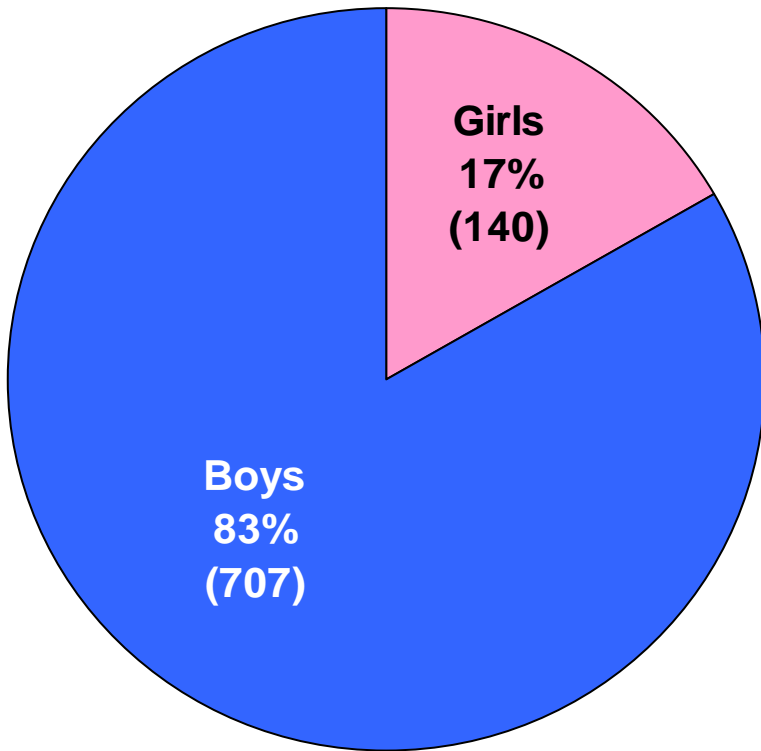

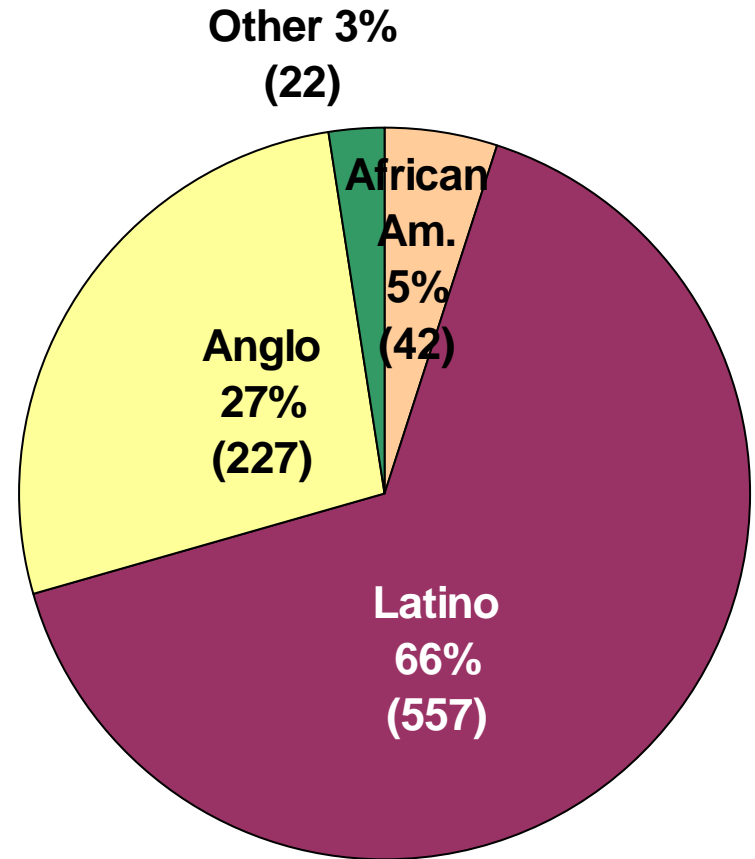

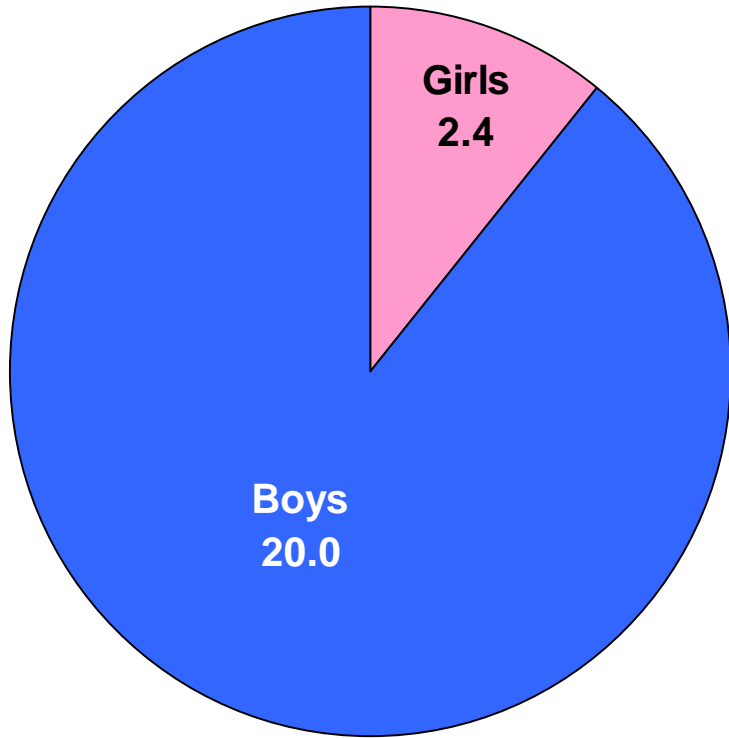

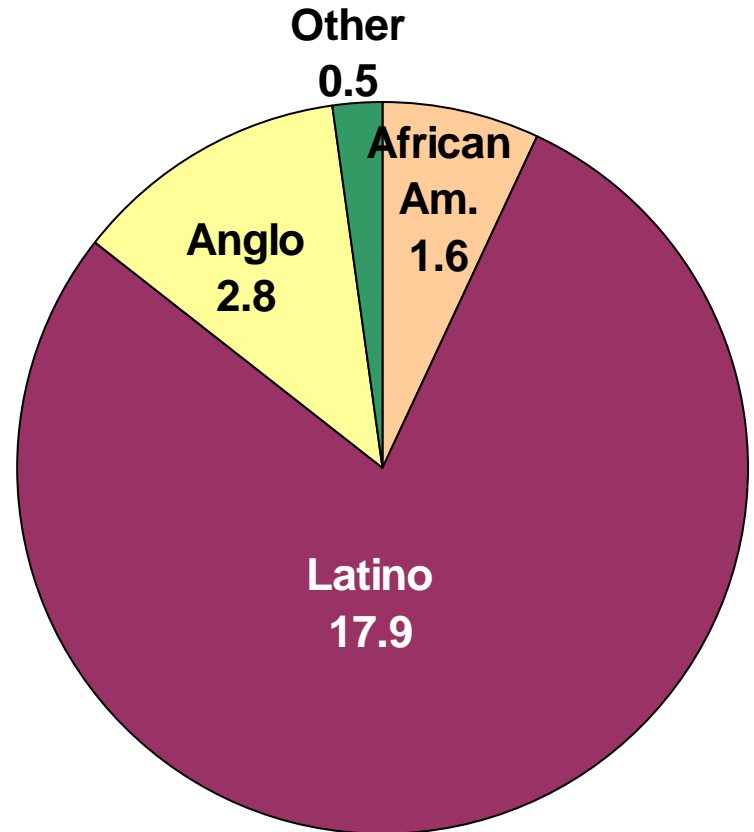

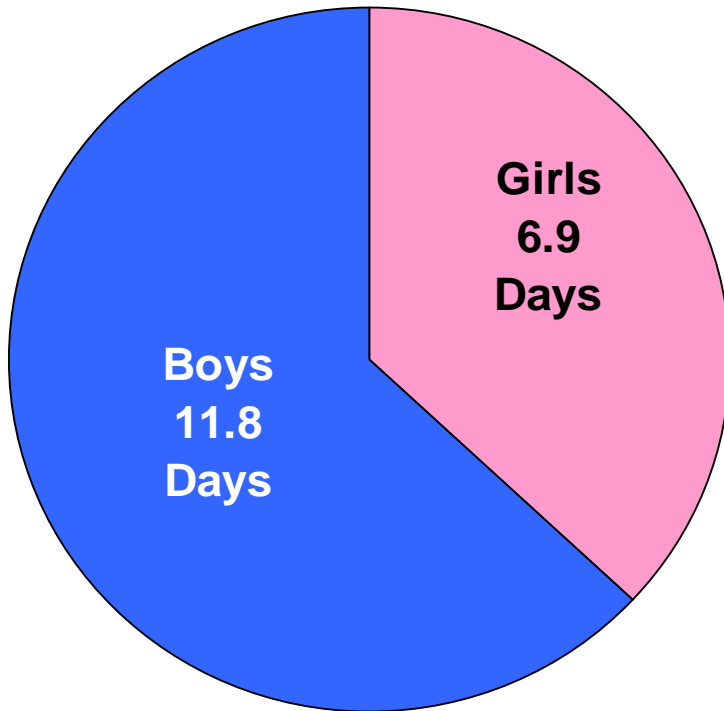

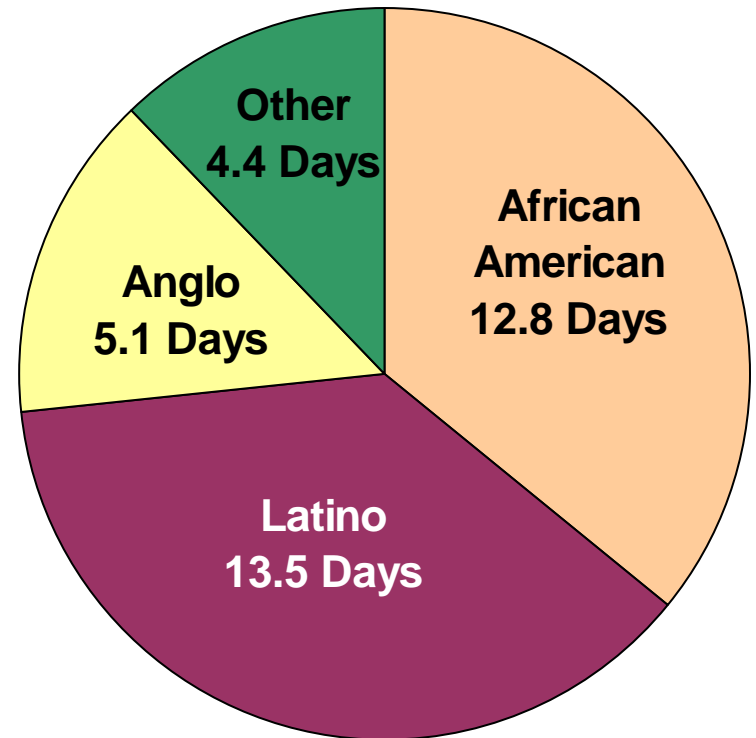

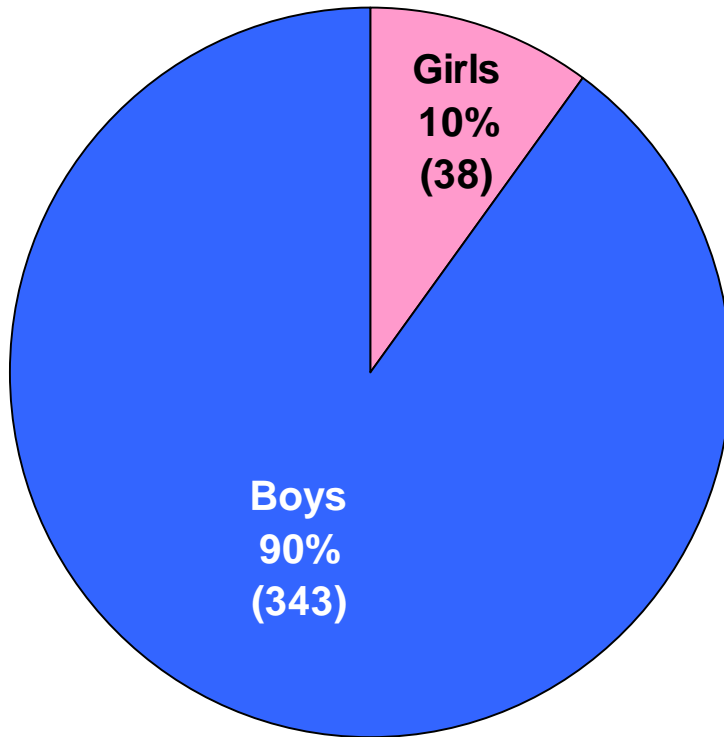

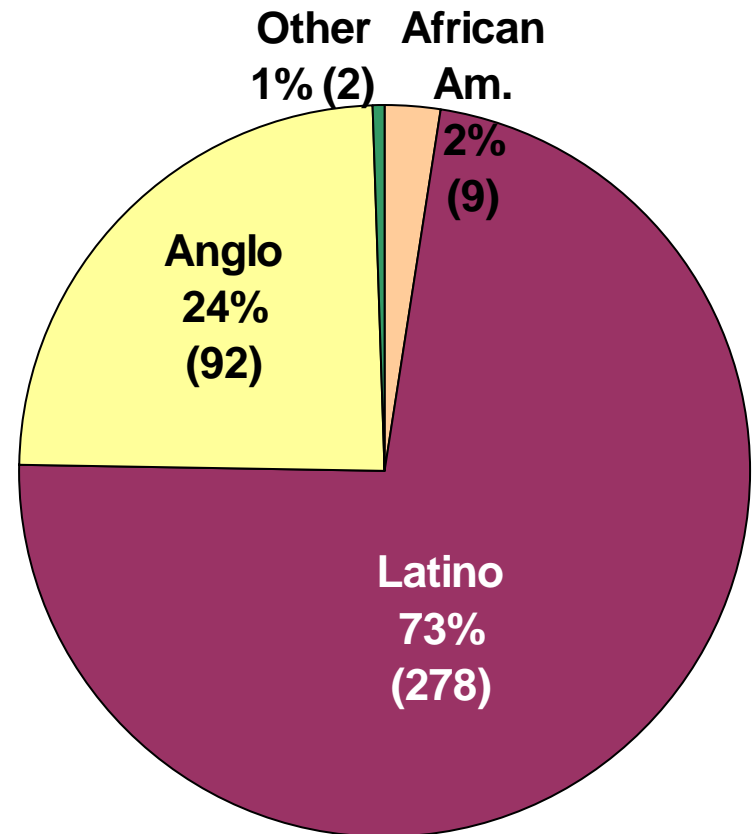
# Santa Cruz County Detention Alternatives Home Supervision / Electronic Monitoring

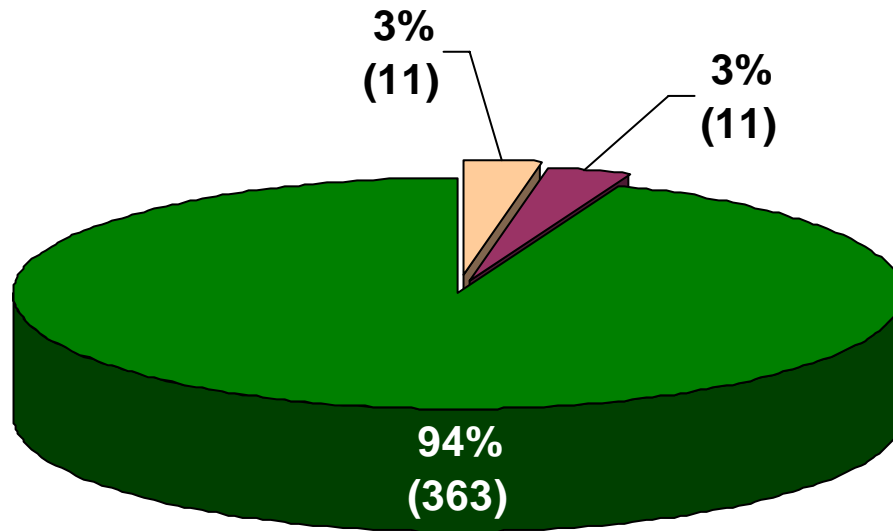

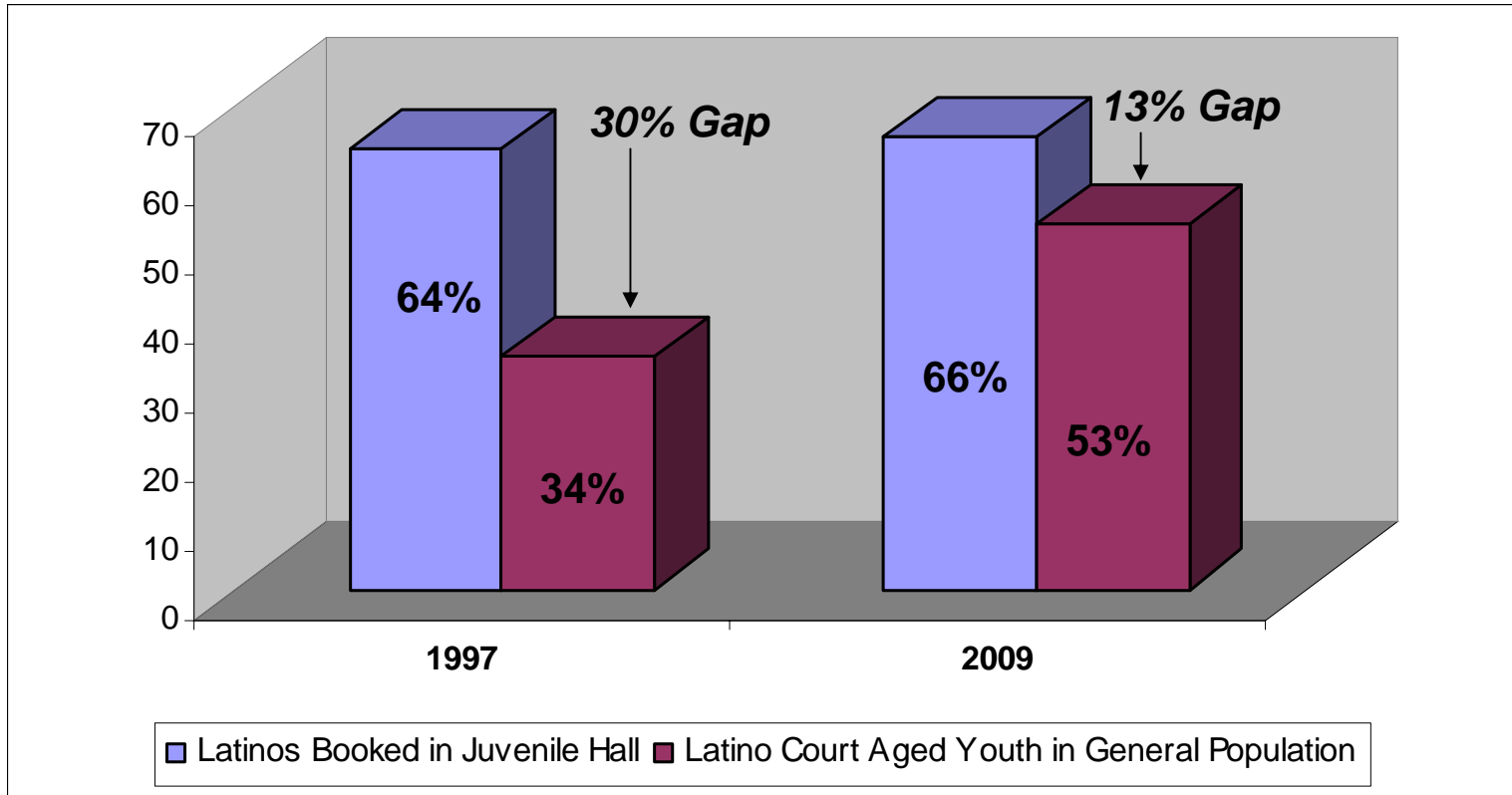

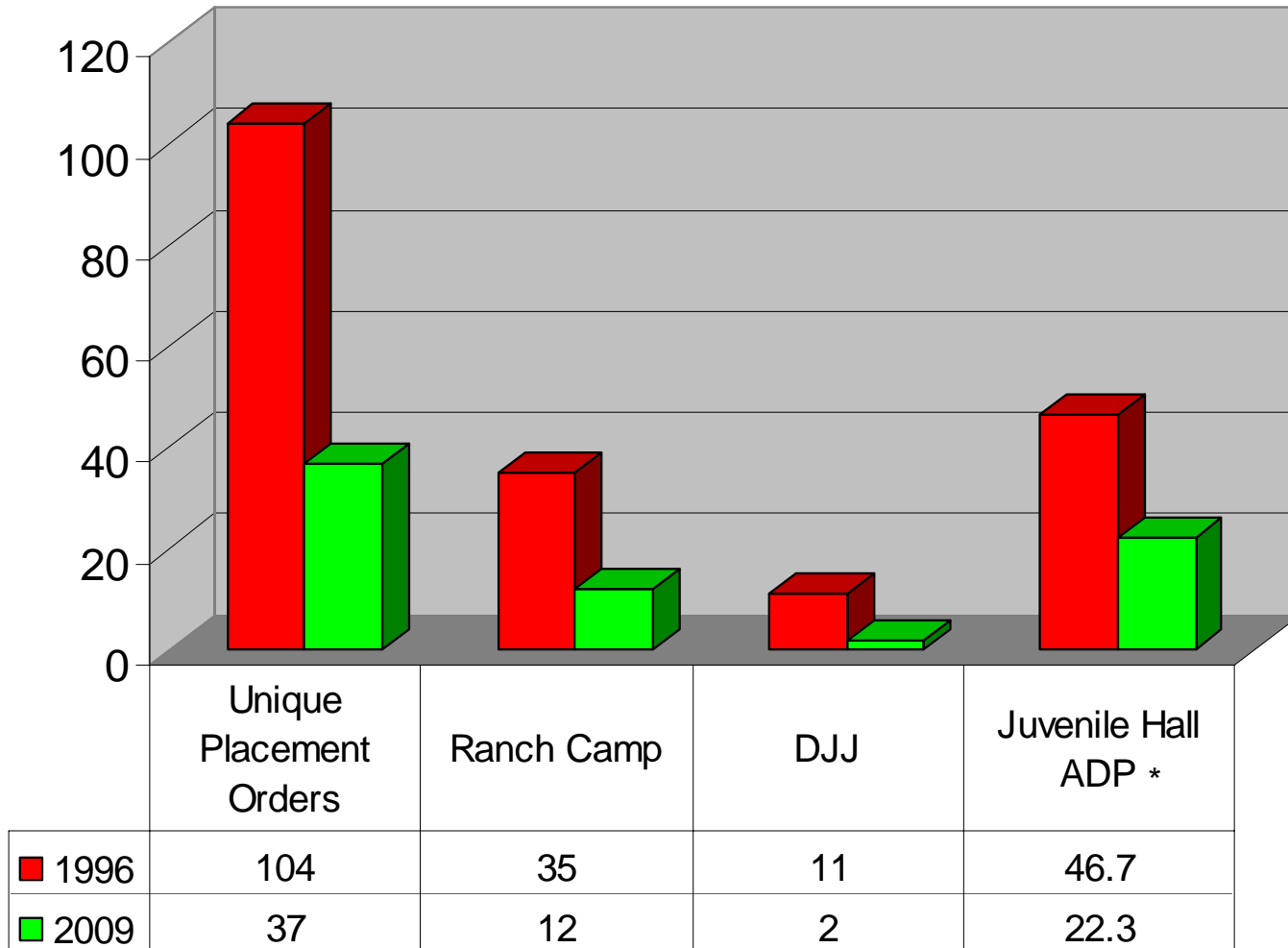
# Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall Reduction in Disproportionate Minority Confinement
