JCP Score	Risk to Reoffend	Intervention Level²	Sanctions, Services, and Supervision	Disposition Options
0-5	Low	1	Youth at this level present with the least need for intervention to provide community protection, and protective factors are evidenced in ensuring youth's success. They require the least restrictive sanction/s and/or supervision and they do not need intensive services to prevent recidivism.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Civil Agreement • Intake Office Contact and Close • Refer to Other Agency • Informal Sanction (minimum on any felony) • Community Service or Restitution • Adjustment from Level 2
6-13	Medium	2	Youth at this level present with an increased need for supervision to provide community protection with some protective factors evidenced. More restrictive sanctions and moderately intensive services are needed to prevent recidivism.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Civil Agreement • Formal Accountability Agreement • Adjustment from Level 3 after petition dismissal for Conditional Postponement or Formal Accountability Agreement, or the allegation is not a public safety allegation and does not rise to adjudication
14-30	High	3	Youth at this level present with the most serious community protection issues and often lack protective factors. Intensive services and supervision are necessary to engage the youth in addressing risk factors and building protective factors to prevent recidivism.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Formal Probation • Formal Probation and EM / CD • DHS and Formal Probation • OYA - Community Placement and Formal Probation • Adjustment from Level 2 if community protection is a significant concern • OYA - Youth Correctional Facility
