

Violation of Probation

If youth violate their probation, graduated sanctions are applied for both formal and informal tracks, as described in the chart on the next page.

In addition, the JPPO can impose further sanctions from the “Range of Responses for Technical Violations” (see page 23).

Reinforcement of Positive Behavior

For positive behavior, the JPPO may extend any of the following from the list below.

Incentive List

1. Early termination of supervision
2. Judicial review
3. Waive fines
4. Modify non-treatment conditions
 - ★ Reduction of drug tests
 - ★ Donation of canned good/non-perishable items in lieu of community service
 - ★ Community service credits for school, work or counseling
 - ★ Reduce face-to-face contacts
 - ★ Curfew adjustment
5. Positive recognition
 - ★ Certificate of completion of a program
 - ★ Gift certificate to a restaurant, movie passes etc.
6. Special Privileges
 - ★ Stay the night with a friend
 - ★ Attend community/church events
 - ★ Attend school dance
 - ★ Recreational activities to include hunting
 - ★ Extend travel permit
 - ★ Extend driving privileges
