

PROTOCOL BCJDC
GENDER RESPONSIVE ADOLESCENT DAY TREATMENT PROGRAM
CHILDREN'S TREATMENT CENTER (CTC)

- Youth is brought to BCJDC by local law enforcement
- RAI is applied
- If RAI score indicates hold or if there is an override by the JPPO the youth is placed on a unit
- The JPPO completes PI and prepares for Eleven A.M. review meeting
- Case is reviewed at 11:00 a.m. meeting and recommendations are developed
- If a female resident is tentatively identified for referral to CTC at the 11:00 a.m. meeting, the Case Expediter notifies the CTC of the potential referral.
- CTC staff will attempt to interview the youth prior to the detention hearing and make a determination as to whether they will be able to accept her based on space and appropriateness for the program. BCJDC clinical staff may be asked by CTC to assist in this determination as the need requires. They will communicate their determination directly to the court or to the JPPO representative who will be presenting the case.
- Case is presented to a Special Master or assigned Judge at the detention hearing.
- Court determines one of four options:
 - Youth remains in custody
 - These female residents will continue to be monitored by the Case Expediter to determine if circumstances have changed to the point that the youth may be eligible for CCP and/or CTC. The behavior of the female resident while in the facility will be one factor for consideration.
 - Youth is released to the custody of parent, guardian, custodian with or without conditions
 - Youth is made eligible for CCP and/or CTC

- Female resident is made eligible for consideration for furlough from BCJDC for the purposes of attending the Gender Responsive Adolescent Day Treatment Program at CTC
 - Once the resident is made eligible and when space is available at the CTC the Case Expediter will prepare the order for the furlough and present it to the assigned Judge for consideration and approval. The assigned Judge will determine if a further court hearing is required and if so Court staff will notify the parties.
 - if the furlough is ordered, BCJDC will transport youth to CTC Monday through Friday for programming. At least one staff person will remain at the CTC to monitor youth. BCJDC transport staff will notify CTC if youth is required for a court proceeding and/or medical appointments that will preclude the youth participation on any given day.
 - at the conclusion of the program day, youth will be returned to BCJDC to continue in custody.
 - If the youth is progressing in the programming, and if staff with court approval, feel it is appropriate, the youth will be released from custody, as soon as possible but will not be longer than 21 days in furlough status. The Court may require the addition of CCP supervision for youth released from custody. The Court will determine if a hearing is required and if so Court staff will notify the parties. The youth is required to continue participating in the CTC programming until the case is disposed and/or treatment is completed. If the youth does not complete or is disqualified from the CTC programming while on furlough the assigned JPPO will notify the parties and the Court.
 - when the case is disposed, and if the youth is placed on probation, the Juvenile Probation/Parole unit designated to supervise females provides supervisions
