

Detention Risk Assessment Instrument Instructions and Definitions

The Detention Risk Assessment Instrument (DRAI) is an objective risk-based tool that will determine detention recommendations.

The DRAI will be completed on all youth admitted to detention without exception.

The DRAI is to be completed based on the circumstances at the moment of booking. If circumstances change **DO NOT** change the DRAI after the fact.

It is extremely important that the information on the DRAI is accurate, complete and signed by the completing intake officer.

Involvement in offense was remote, indirect or otherwise mitigated.	Youth's action were not directly responsible for the offense.	Circle if applicable.
Parent or relative can assume immediate responsibility for minor.	Responsible adult has agreed to take responsibility for youth and has made reasonable assurances that youth will appear for next court hearing.	Circle if applicable.
No arrests or citations within the last year.	"Court history" is defined at a minimum as having a filed on offense.	Circle if applicable.

Parent, guardian or responsible relative cannot be located	Parent or guardian cannot be immediately found to pick up the releasable youth.	Check if applicable.
Parent, guardian or responsible relative refuses custody	Parent or guardian refuses to pick up releasable youth.	Check if applicable.
Other, Minor is detained because.....	Any reason other than the two mentioned above. Must be explained.	Check if applicable.

RELEASE OVERRIDE

(ALL OVERRIDES WILL BE APPROVED BY THE DETENTION MANAGER)

Minor is released because.....	Any reason a release a granted on an otherwise detainable youth. Must be explained.	Check if applicable.
